That is why we made a decision to continue providing quality telecommunications services without interruption in services over the past year, even though we have not received support from Universal Service Funds (USF).

FCC Takes Unprecedented Move

Although we are excited about our mission, it has not been easy. The Federal Communications Commission (FCC) took the unprecedented step to suspend USF funds to Sandwich Isles Communications while conducting an audit.

Now we are told that the FCC may seek punitive measures based on audit results that are mainly about disagreements on how our phone lines are classified, not on abuse of USF funds. Sandwich Isles Communications has followed industry standards in these matters, based on the recommendations of specialized consultants who work with other telecommunications companies across the nation.

There is a danger that the FCC's actions could jeopardize services that are currently being provided to our subscribers, so we ask that you contact FCC Commissioners and our Congressional delegates to voice your concern.

Sandwich Isles Communications Helping to Build West Oahu Shopping Mall

West Oahu residents now have a community gathering place they can call their own. Ka Makana Ali'i, which means The Royal Gift, is a 1.4 million-square-foot regional mall on Hawaiian Home Lands in Kapolei whose tenants are being served by Sandwich Isles Communications.

The mall is being developed by DeBartolo Development, and when complete, will feature more than 150 exciting shopping, dining and entertainment offerings, two hotels and LEED-certified office space. It is DeBartolo's first project in Hawai'i.





Major Anchors

The development has already attracted major anchors. The first tenant in the mall was Macy's, which opened to the public on September 1, 2016. Other major tenants to date include Hampton Inn, Consolidated Theaters, and California Pizza Kitchen.

Sandwich Isles Communications has completed installation for more than 60 of the 89 tenants. Additional installations are currently scheduled

through the end of the year and Sandwich Isles Communications is ready to support the additional customers when they are ready to order their service, according to **Paige Onishi**, Business Development Director for Sandwich Isles Communications.

As with any great endeavor, it has taken a lot of time, energy and commitment to reach this point. The Sandwich Isles Communications team has been meeting with **DeBartolo**, the Department of Hawaiian Home Lands, and engineers on this project since 2009. Since 2015, Sandwich Isles Communications team members have participated in bi-weekly meetings with DeBartolo; contractors; **Skye Group**, the leasing company; and JLL, the mall management company.
